The annual Theatre Roulette can be chaotic. exhilarating and exhausting, but two men involved in the latest MadLab festival keep returning for more.

"It's a labor of love," said Andy Batt, managing director. "I really don't do much else with my life during the festival."

During the ninth annual event, opening tonight, Batt's roles include festival coordinator, technical director. production stage manager. director of Dark North, actor in This Bird and director of several preview videos.

The first Theatre Roulette festival in 2000 sparked his interest in joining the troupe, he said.

Of the 50 people involved in creative and technical roles this year, Batt is the only one who has acted in all nine Roulettes.

Rental is another," Levine said from his home in Pasadena, Calif.

The Rental revolves around a woman who receives a strange present for her 30th birthday: a boyfriend for a

day. "Writing a 10-minute play forces you to be very tight and fast-paced," said Levine, who has had more than 300 plays produced worldwide. "If you're writing a comedy, you have to keep it funny."

His Surprise, which premiered at the 2005 festival, is a fast-paced romantic comedy about a man whose limited psychic powers annoy his date.

Saver, produced at last year's festival, is a Levine drama about a middle-aged couple coping with a father's leftovers.

"It's actually wonderful to get into a festival because they always get tons of submissions and yours is a long shot," said Levine, 44. "When

you feel you start to have a relationship with a theater that likes your work, it's very gratifying." MadLab, Levine said, is

good to its playwrights, keeping in "constant contact" as scripts are rehearsed, refined and performed.

As in past years, the company will end its four-week Roulette run with a celebratory marathon. All nine plays will be performed — Rental — one with breaks — May 24.

"On the last performance of the last day," Batt said, "we bring out anyone (involved) in the audience, and we fill the stage."
